The kura is trucking along through the sunnier spring weather with the end of the school year in sight.

At the time of writing we are preparing for the Mountain School Athletics Day. This is where Ōwhango hosts our nearby schools (Kaitieke, Manunui and National Park) in the domain for the day. You are all welcome to come and watch, it is on Friday 25th October, postponement day Wednesday 30th.

Alternatively, you could come to the school for our Pet Day and Spring Festival on Monday 4th November from 12:01pm. This is where the children bring their pets to school for the afternoon and compete in the classrooms for a range of creative activities such as baking decorated as an animal or spring theme, a decorative sand saucer or miniature garden, a gift for a grandparent, a raft that is paddled across the school pool. Some of the children sell their creations after the judging is completed, so bring some cash.

Property news- we have recently had new carpets installed in all of the classrooms, building work on our new staffroom is starting on the 1st of February, at the same time we will be getting ceiling insulation installed in the administration area of the school- as currently there is none and in winter it is an icebox unless the heat pumps are constantly on! We will also be converting one of the classrooms into a technology room next year with ovens and a range of appliances and tools installed to enable this to be taught in a designated area-this is a consequence of the high school withdrawing technology lessons at the start of last year.
